- New international clinical guidelines on prevention and treatment of pressure ulcer will be presented
- New Danish clinical guidelines will be launched
- Possibility to see how pressure ulcer prevention is managed in nursing homes in Sønderborg municipality
- Receive an overview of current research and development trends in academia in regard to a spectrum of knowledge and technologies in the pressure ulcer field.
